The Wilton-Lyndeborough Cooperative School District seeks to locate and identify all Children who may have an educational disability. Any person may make a referral for Evaluation of a child under the age of 21 for reasons including, but not limited to, the following:
Failing to pass a hearing or vision screening
• Unsatisfactory performance on group achievement or accountability measures
• Receiving multiple academic or behavioral warnings
• Repeatedly failing one or more subject
The child find requirements of the district also apply to highly mobile children, homeless children, and children who are suspected of having an educational disability even though they are advancing from grade to grade. Child Find also includes those children in grades K-12 who attend approved, nonpublic private schools within the geographic boundaries of Wilton and Lyndeborough regardless of where they reside. Referrals may be initiated in a variety of ways: For children ages 3 through Kindergarten who do not yet attend school - please contact the office of Student Support Services at 732-9175. For children who attend the Wilton-Lyndeborough Cooperative School District - Building Principals, special education teachers, or classroom teachers may be contacted by anyone wishing to initiate a referral.

a. Case #2025-16-Variance Request-Proposed fourth additional rental apartment unit- Applicant: 359 Nashua Street, LLC-located @ 359 Nashua Street, Map 30 Lot 47
The applicant, 359 Nashua Street, LLC, has requested a Variance to construct a proposed 4th residential (rental) multi-family apartment within the existing Three (3) Unit residence. No external building footprint revisions are being proposed with this additional dwelling unit. The lot is only .33-acre in size; and zoned Limited Commercial Business ("LCB"), which pursuant to Section 5.07.1.H of the Milford Zoning Ordinance, only allows a maximum of five (5) multi-family residential units per acre. Thus, the applicant is required to seek Variance Approval to allow for the requested 4th dwelling unit on this .33-acre lot.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS UNDER "FERPA"
The family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age (eligible students) certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:
1. The right to inspect and review the student's educational records within 45 days of the day the School District receives a request for access.
Parents of eligible students should submit to the building principal or the principal's designee a written request that identifies the records(s) they wish to inspect. The building principal or his/her designee will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believe are inaccurate or misleading.
Parents or eligible students may ask the School District to amend a record generated by the School District that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the building principal or his/her designee, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the School District decides to not amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the School District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. If the parents request a hearing, it shall be conducted by the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee.
3. The right to consent, or to deny consent, to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
One exception, which permits disclosure without consent of a parent or eligible student, is disclosure to "school officials with a legitimate educational interest". A school official is a person employed by the School as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the School has outsourced services or functions it would otherwise use its own employees to perform (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee; or a parent, student, or other volunteer assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. The School District may disclose without consent "directory information", which is information not generally considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. Directory information includes: Name of the student, participation in officially recognized teams or activities, student's class designation, name of the school the student is attending, achievements, awards and honors. Parents may request, in writing to the building principal by October 30th that the School District refrain from making all or some of the directory information on their child available to the public. Upon request, the School District discloses education records without consent to officials of a school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.
4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the School District to comply with the requirements of FERPA.
