

# Faith, Hope, Love!

**TUCKER COUNTY**

Tucker County was created by an act of the Virginia General Assembly on March 7, 1856 from parts of Randolph County. The county was named in honor of Henry St. George Tucker, Sr. (1780-1848). In 1861, as a result of the Wheeling Convention, Tucker County joined the rest of West Virginia in breaking away from Virginia to remain a part of the Union.

Between 1889 and 1893, a dispute known as the Tucker County Seat War took place between the people in the town of Parsons and that of St. George, over the location of the county seat. Although nobody was killed in the “war,” the situation came to a climax when a mob of armed men from Parsons marched on St. George and took the county records by force.

Beginning in 1907, the Babcock Lumber Company of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, while operating out of Davis, West Virginia, clear cut the mountain ridges throughout Tucker County. This clear cutting, with its residual slashings, converted the landscape into a “tin-derbox.” By 1910, fires burned continuously leaving little other than thin mineral soil and bare rock. In 1914, with the county virtually denuded of standing trees, the ground burned continually for six months. As a result, top soils that once produced huge timbers on the

mountainsides including the largest tree ever harvested in West Virginia, a white oak some 13 feet in diameter washed down into the narrow valleys and bottom lands, which had always been too narrow for harvesting productive crops or livestock. To this day, Tucker County and surrounding regions bear the scars of this remarkable conflagration.

# CITY OF PARSONS

Parsons, known as “The River City,” is the county seat of Tucker County; located at the head of the Cheat River, at the Intersection of U.S. 219 and W.Va. 72. Parsons is the perfect place to enjoy outdoor adventures in the most beautiful mountains of West Virginia. Many call Parsons “home,” because of its close-knit community that binds together through good and bad times.

Parsons became an incorporated town on June 12, 1893, and an incorporated city on February 18, 1907. Parsons was named for Ward Parsons, not the first settler but the most prominent and largest landholder. The Battle of Corrick’s Ford, a confederate defeat, took place in Parsons on July 13, 1861. Parsons boomed in the early 20th century and peaked during 1920s

through 1940s. Changes in natural resources caused the economy to fall in the 1950s and 1960s. The 1985 flood was devastating to Parsons. More than 90 percent of the businesses in the area, as well as homes, were damaged or destroyed. A study completed in July 1999 by The Parsons Advocate, the county’s newspaper, showed the town’s population fell from 1,937 in 1980 to 1,453 in 1990. The town’s population was 1,485 in 2010.

The City of Parsons Business Office is located on the first floor of the Charles W. “Bill” Rosenau Municipal Building, 341 Second Street, Parsons. Normal business hours are Monday to Friday from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Come and see for yourself why Parsons is “A Small City with a Big Heart.”



**Town of Davis**

Named for industrialist and United States Senator, Henry Gassaway Davis (1823-1916), the Town of Davis was incorporated in 1880 with a population of 909. By 1902 the population of Davis peaked at 3,000 and was home to over 80 businesses, including eight saloons and eight churches. In 1924 the Davis Lumber mills had produced nearly 900 million board feet of lumber from along the mighty Blackwater River and surrounding forests. In 1934 the West Virginia State Park Commission obtained a 10-year lease on 446 acres surrounding the Falls of Blackwater and in 1937 Blackwater Falls State Park was established. The lodge and cabins would be built later and officially dedicated in 1957.

The Town of Davis was well known for being a boisterous lumber town

and enjoyed great prosperity for many years before the railroad discontinued service to the area. Currently, many old buildings have new occupants that offer a variety of restaurants, beverage establishments-including two Micro-Breweries, lodging and West Virginia arts & crafts. The area has become well known for its outdoor recreation including: mountain biking, fishing, hiking and the newly installed Tucker Boulder Park.

The Town of Davis currently has over 600 residents, is the highest incorporated town in the State of West Virginia, with an elevation of 3,100 feet and has W.Va. 48, a four-lane highway, situated less than a mile outside of its town limits. The easy access from the surrounding areas has made it a popular weekend get-away destination.

### City of Thomas

The City of Thomas is known as “Everyone’s Hometown,” a slogan that encompasses the city’s past and future. Chartered in 1892, Thomas was incorporated as a city on April 17, 1925. The census around that time was 2,099 persons. Thomas was named for Colonel Thomas Beall Davis (1828-1911), a pioneer railroad and mine owner in that section of the state and brother of Sen. Henry Gassaway Davis.

The Davis brothers, in 1883, opened a mine near Thomas and had coal ready to ship when their railway arrived a year later. By 1892, Davis Coal and Coke was among the largest and best known coal companies in the world and employed 1,600 people. At the peak of its operations in 1915, there were nine producing mines within a mile of the company’s office in Thomas.

It was during this time that immi-

grants flocked to the area as miners, railroad laborers, or merchants to build the railroad and work in the mines and lumber camps.

In 1901, in less than two hours, nearly half of Thomas (83 buildings) was destroyed by a fire. The town was quickly rebuilt with fine hotels and workers added a new opera house, the Cottrill’s Opera House. In 1909, Front Street (also known as First Street, Main Street, and East Avenue) was laid with brick to become the first paved street in the county.

With an official elevation of 3,013 feet Thomas is the third highest municipality in the state. The City of Thomas has four locations listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Cottrill’s Opera House, Davis Coal and Coke Company Administrative Building, Fairfax Stone and Thomas Commercial Historic District.

### Swinging Bridge in Hendricks

The Town of Hendricks was incorporated in 1894 and named for Vice President Thomas A. Hendricks by local coal and timber magnate Henry Gassaway Davis. The town population is just shy of 300 residents. It is located on W.Va. Rt. 72, a mile from the town of Hambleton.

Nestled in the scenic, North Central West Virginia Highlands and the Monongalia National Forest, the town has a public park with a playground, pavilions and a fire pit as well as a “swinging bridge” that crosses the Black Fork River. Hendricks is located at the base of the Blackwater Canyon and also hosts the beginning of the 24 mile Allegheny Highlands Rail Trail,

which follows the original route of the West Virginia Central and Pittsburgh Railway, built in 1884.

Hendricks is conveniently located at the confluence of the Blackwater and the Dry Fork rivers, which form the Black Fork, which is a principal tributary of the Cheat River, and also the head of Cheat River Water Trail. The Fernow Experimental Forest extends south of Hendricks across the Black Fork and the Otter Creek Wilderness extends southward. Parks, playgrounds, pavilions, foot bridges, rivers, streams, mountain trails and wonderful people make Hendricks a destination for everyone, especially hikers, cyclists and outdoor enthusiasts.

# TOWN OF HAMBLETON

The Town of Hambleton was incorporated and established in 1905. The town was named in honor of John A. Hambleton, a director of the West Virginia Central and Pittsburgh Railway. The town was started by the Hulings family in 1884 and was known by the name as Huling until Jan. 1899 when it was changed to Hambleton.

During its glory days, Hambleton had seven hotels, several stores, several churches, a school, doctor's

office and a loyal order of Moose Lodge: From History of Tucker County By: Homer Floyd Fansler

Hambleton has around 220 residents and is located along Rt. 219 and it's town hall is on Rt. 72 between Hendricks and the City of Parsons. It is a small quiet community nestled alongside the Black Fork River having several access points to the beautiful Allegheny Highlands Rail Trail.

# TUCKER COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

The Tucker Community Foundation was started in response to the flood of 1985 when a group of Tucker County citizens realized the need for more local resources. Established in 1989 the mission of the Tucker Community Foundation is “creating opportunities for the communities we serve.”

Tucker Community Foundation is a tax exempt public charity that serves seven counties in West Virginia (Barbour, Grant, Mineral, Preston, Pocahontas, Randolph and Tucker) and one county in Maryland (Garrett). The Foundation facilitates charitable giving intended for local use through endowments, pass-through donations, and estate planning. It also manages endowed funds for donors who want to establish and name a permanent fund for a cause they are passionate about. Donor advised funds are also an option.

The organization currently manages more than 135 Endowed Funds with assets in excess of \$30 million. During the past 30 years the Foundation has awarded more than \$9 million to area students and nonprofit organizations in our service area through grants and scholarships.

The Tucker Community Foundation partners with various community organizations throughout our service area to help realize our mission. Some of the projects include Run For It and the Potomac Highland Volunteer Center. Run For It is an annual 2k/5k race that raises additional support and awareness for community charity causes and organizations held during Leaf Peepers Festival. The event is held during the last Saturday in September. The Potomac Highland Volunteer Center is a new initiative that connects people with opportunities to take action.

Mountaineer Days is an annual homecoming event held during the weekend closest to July 4th in Thomas. The festival began in the early 1970s when Bernie and Mary Stilley, who operated a restaurant business in Thomas, organized the event. Nearly fifty years later the festival continues and is organized by the Mountaineer Days Committee, a group of local volunteers.

Many of the events held during the weekend are similar to the events of past years. The festivities kick off Friday evening with a hot dog sale, cake walk, silent auction and block party at the Thomas Volunteer Fire Department.

On Saturday morning crafters and vendors fill the railroad grade and start selling their products while children line up to compete in the patriotic bicycle contest. The popular Mountaineer Days Parade begins mid-morn-

ing. Spectators arrive early lining up along the streets. After lunch people gather at Miners & Merchants to try their luck at winning cakes at the county's largest cake walk sponsored by the Mountaineer Humane Society.

The Firemen's Water Battle is also a featured event on Saturday afternoon drawing numerous firefighters from surrounding departments. Hundreds of onlookers line up to watch the fire departments compete head-to-head. Afterwards local music artists take the stage to entertain the crowd. The highlight of the stage is the "Elvis" impersonator who performs prior to the fireworks show.

The grand finale of Saturday is the spectacular 45-minute fireworks display sponsored by the Thomas VFD, that begins at dusk. The weekend activities conclude with a pancake breakfast at the Thomas VFD Sunday morning.

This is an outdoor music event with


food and craft vendors. The venue offers 10,000 square feet of covered seating. Festival is held rain or shine. Don’t forget your blanket and chairs.

# PARKS & RECREATION

**The Rail Trail is a scenic trail that provides panoramic views of the countryside from Elkins to Thomas as it passes through small towns, rural farmland and along rivers. This trail follows the original route of the West Virginia Central and Pittsburgh Railway built by Henry Gassaway Davis in 1884.**

With more than 50 percent of Tucker County’s geography being protected lands, what remains is incredibly important to us here. There are three state parks – Blackwater Falls, Canaan Valley Resort, and Fairfax Stone – two designated wilderness areas – Dolly Sods and Otter Creek – the Canaan Valley Wildlife Refuge, and the Monongahela National Forest. The land here is transformed each season.

Locals and visitors alike tour the county’s natural resources by hiking, biking, fishing, hunting, bird watching, skiing, snowshoeing, sledding, tub-

ing, rafting, birding and more. There are endless outdoor opportunities throughout the county.

This is the land that residents play in, but it is also the land residents live in. Farmers markets, community gardens, food and farm initiatives, and a farm discovery center combine to provide the county with fresh local foods and to educate the county and its visitors. Tucker County has honey makers, bread bakers, beer brewers, gardeners, farmers, and more. Whether you are a local or tourist, we hope you enjoy and learn from this land.
